NASTY BUGS IN THE NEWS

COVID-19 is causing widespread panic and having a significant impact not just on health, but also on business, sport and travel. The numbers of cases in South Africa is growing daily, with the NICD reporting 13 positive cases by 11 March 2020. Follow one-nicd_sa on Twitter for frequent updates on the situation in South Africa. The NICD have produced a very useful toolkit for health workers which is updated regularly as more information becomes available.

Carbapenem-resistant Enterobacteriacae (CRE) is in the public eye again. The Gauteng Department of Health confirmed that 10 babies had died at Tembisa Hospital neonatal unit due to a CRE outbreak. Tygerberg Hospital (Western Cape) neonatal service reported a CRE outbreak in February 2019. Ballot et al. recently published a retrospective review of multi-drug resistant Enterobacteriaceae (MDRE), noting a significant increase in MDRE infections in neonatal sepsis. It is up to all paediatricians in South Africa to model, teach and improve personal and systemic infection prevention and control practices and antibiotic stewardship programmes. Sharing of best practice and lessons learned is necessary to protect neonates and children in our hospitals.

NEW VISION: NEW MOTIF

The <u>Dreamsmiths</u> team helped SAPA create an icon that generates an immediate identification with paediatrics, and denotes nurturing care. The circular motif (see below) captures the playful nature of children, while the careful alignment and measured lettering grounds the logo in the medical and research component of paediatrics. A fun, diverse colour palette was chosen to reflect the vibrancy of children, alluding to our ultimate objective – seeing a nation of healthy, happy children.

A FUTURE FOR THE WORLD'S CHILDREN? A WHO-UNICEF-LANCET COMMISSION

Creating an environment in which children can reach their greatest potential is an ideal often spoken about in child health circles. In some countries this ideal is a reality, with a high child-flourishing index. However, the earth is being destroyed through reckless action in the same places, leaving an environment unsuitable for children who have been equipped to thrive. This paradox is true in reverse as well, where countries with a low child-flourishing index have

significantly less detrimental impact on the environment. While the earth is theirs for the taking, these children are not able to take full advantage. No country has managed to find a balance or means to correct the paradox, while the damage to the earth by some has major implications that transcend borders.
